

# BAY HARBOR YACHT CLUB

## HOUSE RULES

### ARTICLE 1.

#### PURPOSE

The purpose and objective of Bay Harbor Yacht Club (the "Club") is to operate as a private yacht club for the social and recreational benefit of its Members, and their families, guests and invitees. By authority vested in Section 3.1 of the Bylaws of the Club (the "Bylaws"), the following rules and regulations governing the use of the Club Facilities (these "House Rules") have been approved by the Board of Directors, and are effective September 1, 2001 until further notice. These House Rules supercede and revoke all club rules previously in force, and are binding upon all classes of Members. The words used herein shall have the same meaning as set forth in the Bylaws, as they may be amended from time to time, unless the context shall require otherwise.

### ARTICLE 2.

#### GENERAL

2.1. Hours of Operation. The Club's days and hours of service shall be determined by the Club considering the season of the year and other circumstances, and are subject to change. The hours of operation shall be posted in the clubhouse and published in the newsletter. The business office is open from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

2.2. Conduct. All Members, and their Spouses, Children and guests, shall abide by all of the Bylaws and these House Rules. Parents are responsible for the conduct of their Children at all times. Children under twelve (12) years of age are not permitted on the Club premises unless accompanied by a parent or guardian.

2.5. Members' Accounts. Food and beverage charges, purchases, equipment rentals, and other charges incurred by a Member, Spouse, Child or guest shall be billed to the responsible Member's Club Account. Members shall sign for all purchases using their Club Account number. Spouses and Children shall sign their own name and the name and Club Account number of the Member. Only Members, Spouses and unmarried Children under the age of twenty-four (24) and attending school full-time, may sign for charges. Guests may sign for charges on a Member's Club Account only with the prior written approval of the Member.

Members are responsible to ensure that their guests comply with the Bylaws and the House Rules.

Any Member, Spouse, Child or guest who conducts himself or herself in an unbecoming manner or who knowingly violates any Club policy or rule may be denied service by the Club and/or be sanctioned as provided in the Bylaws and these House Rules.

2.3. Food and Beverages. All food and beverages consumed at the Facilities must be furnished by the Club and may be consumed only in areas designated by the Club, except for approved picnics on the beach.

The Food and Beverage Minimum policy is as follows: The minimum year is from May 1 until April 30 of the following year. Only a la carte and member special event food and beverage charges apply to toward the minimum charge. Sales tax and service charges do not apply. The deadline for minimum charges is on April 30 of each year.

2.4. Alcoholic Beverages. No alcoholic beverages shall be served or consumed at the Club Facilities in violation of Michigan law. The Club staff has been instructed to enforce all state liquor regulations, including the following:

- (a) Gambling is not permitted in the clubhouse.
- (b) No alcoholic beverages shall be brought into or removed from the Club Facilities by Members, Spouses, Children or guests.
- (c) Members, Spouses, Children and guests under the age of twenty-one (21) may not consume beverage alcohol on the Club premises.
- (d) Intoxicated persons will not be served beverage alcohol.
- (e) Minors may not sit at the bar.

Regular members' accounts must be in good standing in order for their children or grandchildren (Legacy members) to have privileges in the Club. If a Regular member's account is suspended the Legacy member will also be suspended from privileges in the Club.

All expenses, including costs and attorneys' fees, incurred by the Club for checks returned by the Member's bank shall be borne by the responsible Member.

The Yacht Club bills on a thirty (30) day cycle. To avoid finance charges, payment must be received in the business office by the last day of each month.

2.6. Club Equipment. No property or furniture of the Club shall be removed from the room or other area in which it is placed without the prior approval of the Club. No Club property shall be loaned or removed from the Club Facilities without prior written permission from the Club.

A Member shall be responsible for damage to Club property resulting from misuse by the Member, or by his or her Spouse, Children or guests. All repair or replacement costs will be charged to the responsible Member.

2.7. Traffic and Parking. Access to the Club is through the Yacht Club gatehouse entrance on US 31. Guests must be registered prior to their arrival and must give their name and the name of the sponsoring Member to the gatehouse guard upon their arrival.

All Members, Spouses, Children and guests must observe all speed limit and parking requirements. Vehicles shall be parked only in appropriate parking spaces and in strict observance of any traffic regulations that may be established. Car Parking is not permitted in the circle drive at any time. Members and guests are prohibited from parking on Shores Drive to gain beach access. Vehicles which are parked in reserved, restricted or unmarked areas may be removed at the expense of the responsible Member.

Parking decals are issued to Members and must be displayed on the lower left side of the windshield.

Recreational vehicles (“RVs”), and mopeds, minibikes, all-terrain vehicles, boat trailers, jet skis, and other licensed and unlicensed motorized vehicles are not permitted at the Club Facilities without the prior permission of the Club. Motorcycles and bicycles shall be restricted to parking areas only and are subject to the same rules and regulations as other vehicles. Bicycles are not permitted on the Yacht Docks. Rollerblades, skateboards, roller skates, ice skates and scooters (motorized and non-motorized) are not permitted anywhere on Yacht Club property.

2.8. Solicitation. The membership roster may not be released to any non-member and may not be used for any commercial purpose. No advertisement, solicitation, petition or notice shall be distributed or posted at the Club Facilities without the prior approval of the General Manager. No business activity or solicitation of any kind shall be conducted at the Club Facilities without the prior

approval of the Club. Charitable and other solicitation of the membership may only be made by specific Board authority.

2.9. Pets. Pets (with the exception of seeing eye dogs) are not permitted in the clubhouse or in outdoor food service areas. Pets are not allowed on the beach during operating hours and must be leashed and under the control of their owner at all times while on the beach and other Yacht Club property. Each owner must clean up after their pet. Members are responsible for any damage or injury caused by an animal owned by, or brought upon the Club Facilities by, such Member, his or her Spouse, Children or guests.

2.10. Firearms/Fireworks. Firearms, lethal weapons and ammunition are not permitted in the clubhouse or anywhere else on the Club property. Fireworks are permitted only in areas designated for fireworks displays and only when authorized by the Club. The Club cannon must be fired by authorized Club staff.

2.11. Controlled Substances. Controlled substances (as defined by state and federal law), other than those prescribed by a physician for medical reasons, are not permitted on Club property. The sale, exchange or unlawful use of a controlled substance on Club property is prohibited. Persons found to be under the unlawful influence of a controlled substance while on the Club premises will be considered to be engaged in conduct detrimental to the best interests of the Club and shall be subject to disciplinary action.

2.12. Publicity. The Club is a private club whose recreational and social activities are intended for the benefit of its Members and guests. Accordingly, the Club neither seeks nor welcomes publicity outside of the membership about its activities. Inquiries from the media concerning the Club, its Members or practices shall be directed to and solely responded to by the General Manager or other Board-designated representative. No other Member or Club employee shall discuss Club events, policies, rules, bylaws or affairs with the media.

If members of the press or other media are guests of Members of the Club, they shall be advised by the Members inviting them that the Club proceedings and happenings may not be reported and should not be made available for publication.

No Member or Club employee shall initiate, address or solicit to the Club any communication intended to appear in any newspaper, periodical or other publication not directed solely to Members.

The use of photographic or video equipment in the clubhouse or on the Club premises without the prior permission of the General Manager is prohibited. Release of pictures or stories to the press concerning Club activities, whether taken

or obtained at a Club function or at a Member's home, is prohibited. However, at the discretion of the Board of Directors or the General Manager, permission may be granted to take pictures at a party or function in the Club on the assurance that they are for the personal use of the Member hosting the party.

2.13. Leave of Absence. A leave of absence or inactive status may be granted at the discretion of the Board of Directors in the event that a Member must be out of the country for a period of one (1) year or more, or in other extreme or unusual circumstances. During any leave of absence granted, the Member shall pay reduced dues, shall have no usage rights, and must repay all assessments levied during the leave of absence period prior to the reinstatement of the membership.

2.14. Smoking. The clubhouse is a smoke-free facility. Smoking is allowed only in designated areas on outdoor patios.

2.15. Prohibited Activities. The Club shall have the right and power to prohibit any games, sports or other activities which it may, in its determination, consider harmful to the interests of the general membership and/or the Club. Activities prohibited on all Club property include, without limitation, ice skating, roller skating, rollerblading and skateboarding. Scooters (motorized and non-motorized) are also prohibited on Club property. Diving from the Yacht Docks into navigable areas is prohibited. To promote maximum boating and child safety, sailboats, kayaks and paddleboats may not enter Yacht Dock areas.

2.16. Personal Property. Each Member, Spouse, Child or guest is responsible for his or her own personal property. The Club is not responsible for lost property or articles stolen from anywhere on the Club premises and specifically disclaims any such responsibility. Personal property left by any person on the Club premises and not claimed within thirty (30) days may be disposed of by the Club without notice.

Except as otherwise provided herein or permitted by the Club, in its discretion, no guest shall use the Club Facilities unless accompanied by the Member, Spouse or Child of whom he or she is a guest. From time to time, the Club may limit accompanied guests due to availability of services. Guest fees and other charges incurred by the guest may be billed to the sponsoring Member's Club Account or the guest may use their personal credit card.

2.18. Parties/Reservations. The Club wishes to encourage the use of the clubhouse and other Club Facilities by Members for private parties. All private functions must be hosted by a Member who may or may not be present at the function. All private functions must be approved in advance by the Club. A Member must make a reservation with the Club for available dates and

2.17. Unaccompanied Guest Membership Privileges. All Members shall be entitled to limited guest membership privileges, subject to the provisions hereof, payment of applicable guest fees and charges, and subject to such additional rules and regulations as are established from time to time by the Club. Any Member in good standing may request that the Yacht Club extend to a person who meets the following criteria, temporary privileges to use the Club Facilities.

House Guest Members – Houseguests may have limited use of the Club facilities for up to 10 days per calendar year. This privilege allows houseguests the use of all facilities, based on availability. Children and grandchildren of members who use the Club unaccompanied by their parents are encouraged to apply for Legacy Membership if they will use the Club over a ten-day period. Refer to the Club bylaws for information on who should apply for Legacy Membership.

Local Resident Guests – Guests who reside in the area full or part-time (within 50 miles) shall be granted dining privileges up to three days per calendar year, based on availability.

Non-resident Guests – Guests who reside in the area full or part-time (outside of 50 miles) shall be granted dining privileges up to three days per calendar year, based on availability.

The sponsoring Member must submit a letter of introduction in advance. Guest Member privileges may not be extended to the same person more than once during a calendar year and privileges may be used on non-consecutive days. Guest Members must check in upon arrival at the Club. A Member shall be responsible for the conduct of his or her guests at all times while the guests are at the Club Facilities. Guest Member privileges may be denied, withdrawn, or revoked at any time for reasons considered sufficient in the discretion of the Club.

arrangements and must assume full responsibility for the party and for the conduct of such Member's guests in accordance with the Bylaws and these House Rules. A deposit shall be required at the time the reservation is made.

Private functions may not interfere with the service to the membership at large. The clubhouse is available for private parties and Member-sponsored special events, based on availability. The Club will cater private parties and Member-sponsored special events throughout the year, even when regular a la carte dining is not available.

If an unusual number of people are involved and/or whenever special service of any kind is desired, the Club shall establish guidelines regarding notice,

operations, additional services and hours. In the event that a Member cancels a private function with less than forty-eight (48) hours notice, a fee will be applied to the Member's Club Account. No performance by entertainers will be permitted at the Club Facilities without the permission of the Club. All decorations must be approved in advance by the General Manager. The Club may require the advance payment of a security deposit by the Member who assumes responsibility for a private party. The Member sponsoring the party shall be responsible for any damage caused by the installation and removal of party decor.

2.19. Liability. Neither the Club, its Directors, Officers or employees shall be liable for any injuries to persons or damage to or loss of property involving Members, Spouses, Children, guests or other persons on the Club premises. Each Member agrees to indemnify and hold the Club, its Directors, Officers and employees harmless from and against, any and all claims made by their guests or

2.20. Membership Cards. A Membership Card indicating the Member's name, Club Account number, and the type of membership, and containing the name of the authorized user, shall be issued to each Member, and to the Spouse and Children of such Member. Members and Spouses must have their Membership Cards with them at all times while using the Club Facilities. A Membership Card may not be used by any person other than the person to whom it is issued. Membership Cards are nontransferable.

In the event of a lost or stolen Membership Card, the Club must be notified immediately. The Member's Club Account may be canceled, as determined by the Club. In the event the Member's Club Account is canceled, the Club will issue a new Membership Card number. Until notification of card loss or theft is received in writing by the Club, the Member shall be responsible for all charges placed on the account. For each new Membership Card replaced, a charge covering the cost of the replacement card will be placed on the Member's Club Account in such amount as determined by the Club.

2.23. Attire. Members and other persons using the Club facilities shall comply with the following rules of attire: If the policy is not followed the Member or their guests' may be asked to change. Alternative clothing is always available at the club to purchase or borrow.

- Attire for men, women and children must be in good taste and appropriate for the season. It is expected that the Members and other persons will choose to dress in fashion befitting of the surroundings and atmosphere provided in the setting of the Club. It is also expected that Members will advise their guests of the dress requirements. From time to time exceptions to the dress rules may be made, as published by the club.

invitees, occurring on the Club premises for personal injury, damage to, or loss of property not proximately caused by the gross negligence or willful or wanton conduct of Club employees.

The use of Club Facilities by a Member or other person shall constitute an acknowledgement of that person's release of liability and waiver of claim. Each Member shall be legally and financially responsible for his or her acts or omissions, as well as those of his or her Spouse, Children and guests. Each Member shall indemnify and hold the Club, and its Members, Directors, employees, representatives and agents harmless from any loss, cost claim, injury or damage incurred by the Member, his or her Spouse, Children or guests, or arising out of the conduct of the Member, Spouse, Children or guests.

2.21. Reservations and Cancellations. It is the responsibility of each Member to make reservations for dining or other use of the Club when appropriate. Reservations shall be in the name of the person requesting the reservation. The applicable Club Account number must also be given. Reservations shall be honored on a first-come, first-served basis. Table location preferences will be assigned in the order in which reservations are received. The Club has the right to refuse to seat a Member who has no prior reservation when reservations are full. Reservations for dining will be held for only fifteen (15) minutes after the reserved time. Reservations for dining must be canceled by 4:00 p.m. on the day of the reservation, or the Member may be charged a "no show" fee. Reservations for Club-sponsored parties must be canceled by 5:00 p.m. of the preceding day, or the Member will be charged the full event fee.

2.22. Gratuities. Tipping is not permitted at the Club. In lieu of gratuities, a twenty percent (20%) service charge is added to all food and beverage checks.

- Unless in the pool, beach and fitness areas, men are required to wear collared shirts. The exception is a dress non-screened "banded collar" shirt with short or long sleeves. Cotton "T-shirts" **do not** qualify as a dress shirt.

- Shoes must be worn in the clubhouse at all times.
- Bathing attire may only be worn in the pool and beach areas.

- Short shorts, cut-offs, tank tops, T-shirts and similar clothing are not suitable attire.

- "Dress" shorts may be permitted in the dining rooms. This is available at

the managers' discretion.

- Hats must be removed while in the dining rooms and lounge.
- From Memorial Day weekend until October 1, Members and guests in casual attire and jeans will be seated in specific areas and at the discretion of the manager on duty.
- From October 1 until Memorial Day weekend jeans and more casual attire (apres' ski attire) will be permitted in all dining rooms.

2.24. Club Services and Activities. The Club reserves the right to restrict the use of certain Club Facilities to the general membership from time to time due to Member-sponsored special events or private parties. The Club may sponsor various social, cultural and recreational events in which all Members and their Spouses, Children and guests may be invited to participate. Activities will be publicized in a monthly bulletin of the Club.

2.25. Employees. In the interest of orderly management procedure and discipline, Members are not allowed to reprimand or issue orders to employees but are requested to report any employee incivility to the General Manager. Members are specifically requested to refrain from suggesting to employees items that may be pertinent to the improvement of Club operations. All such suggestions should be made to the General Manager only. All complaints or suggestions concerning employees must be transmitted to the General Manager.

### ARTICLE 3.

#### TENNIS AND PLATFORM TENNIS RULES

3.1. Registration. All Members, Spouses, Children and guests must register with the sports desk before playing tennis.

3.2. Hours of Operation. Weather permitting, the tennis courts will be open daily from 8:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m., May 15 through October 31. The platform tennis courts are open year round from 8:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m.

The tennis courts and platform tennis courts will be closed during inclement weather. All users are responsible for their own safety in any tennis court area during hazardous weather conditions. While the Club will attempt to warn users and close the tennis courts when conditions dictate, under no circumstances shall

Arrangements for services must be made through Club management. Employees on duty are not permitted to leave the Club premises on errands or for any other service for Members. Members must not request special personal services from the employees of the Club while they are on duty.

Absent prior approval of the Board or the General Manager, employees may not use Club facilities, and employees may not be invited as Members' guests. It is Club policy to refrain from employing Members' immediate family.

2.26. Unauthorized Entry. Maintenance and equipment buildings and other service areas are off limits to Members, Spouses, Children and guests, unless accompanied by an authorized employee of the Club.

2.27. Delinquent Accounts. Effective management of accounts receivable at the Club is important to the Club and necessary to protect the rights and privileges of every Member. Accordingly, the Board reserves the right to take action against any Member whose Club Account is past due or delinquent in accordance with the provisions of the Bylaws and House Rules. Such measures include, but are not limited to, late fees, interest, suspension of charging privileges, letter of censure, posting on Club bulletin boards and loss of usage privileges.

2.28. Discipline. The General Manager is required to notify the Board of any violation of the Club rules. The Board reserves the right to discipline any Member who violates Club rules in accordance with the provisions of the Bylaws and House Rules. Sanctions include, but are not limited to, fines, restitution, letter of censure and suspension of privileges.

the Club be held liable for failing to warn users of hazardous weather conditions or the need to vacate any tennis court area.

The Club reserves the right to set aside designated time during hours of normal tennis court operation for special events or programs, during which time use by Members may be restricted.

3.3. Rules of Use. Use of the tennis courts is contingent upon compliance with the following rules:

(a) Courts are not to be used when nets are lowered. Courts are not to be used for any purpose other than tennis.

(b) Members are afforded Guest Member privileges in accordance with the Guest Member Policies noted in these House Rules.

(c) Children who are not playing tennis are not permitted to play within the tennis court enclosures.

(d) U.S.L.T.A. rules apply to all play. Good sportsmanship is required on the courts at all times. Members and guests are urged to familiarize themselves with the rules of tennis etiquette, which include the following:

(i) No person shall enter or cross another court while a point is in play;

(ii) All persons requesting the return of a tennis ball from another court should ask only when play on the court has halted. Players should not retrieve a tennis ball from another court themselves; and

(iii) Loud or quarrelsome conduct or profanity is prohibited on the tennis courts. No obnoxious behavior will be permitted.

(e) The tennis professional, any staff member, and the General Manager have the authority to enforce all rules and regulations, to supervise the general conduct of all persons at the tennis courts, to maintain order, and to reprimand, restrict, discipline, and evict any individual not complying with the tennis and platform tennis rules.

3.4. Reservations. Names of all players are required for court reservations. Play during unreserved times shall be on a first-come, first-served basis, with the exception that those who have not previously played that day have priority over Members who already have played. Regardless of the type of reservation made, court time is restricted to one and one-half (1½) hours for singles play, and two (2) hours for doubles play; however, a limit of one and one-half (1½) hours may be imposed for doubles play when other Members are waiting to play. In addition, the Club reserves the right to designate other times when play will be limited. Members may reserve courts by calling the Club up to two (2) days in advance.

All players must register at the tennis courts at least ten (10) minutes before the scheduled starting time. If the party who has reserved a court fails to show or register, the reserved court will be considered open to any waiting Members for play. Court cancellations at least twelve (12) hours before scheduled playing time. Players who do not notify the staff of any for court time or lessons may be charged a court fee, as determined in the discretion of the Club.

Children under the age of eighteen (18) may make reservations for courts in the same manner as adults. At the discretion of the Club, certain hours and courts may be reserved for adults only.

3.5. Attire. Proper tennis attire and regulation equipment are required at all times on the courts. No cutoffs, jeans, bathing attire, sleeveless shirts for men, bare feet, or shoes other than smooth-sole, regulation tennis shoes will be allowed on the courts. Shirts must be worn at all times.

3.6. Tournaments and Clinics. The Club reserves the right to make the tennis courts available for tournament and promotional play, at which time use by Members may be restricted. Except during special events, only members of the professional staff are permitted to render instruction at the Club. Lessons should be scheduled through the sports desk. Lessons not canceled twenty-four (24) hours in advance may be subject to a charge.

3.7. Prohibited Activities. All non-tennis activity on the courts is prohibited, including, but not limited to, ice skating, roller skating, rollerblading, skateboarding, bicycling and scooters (motorized and non-motorized). The cost of repairing any damage to the court surface resulting from such prohibited activity shall be charged to the responsible Member's account.

No food or beverages, other than water, are permitted on the courts. No glass containers are allowed on the courts. Smoking is prohibited on the courts. Pets are not permitted in the tennis court enclosures or on adjacent grounds.

Persons not playing should stay off the court surface. No game other than tennis may be played on the court. Courts should be vacated promptly after the reserved playing time is over.

## ARTICLE 4.

### POOL AND BEACH RULES

4.1. Registration. Members, Spouses and Children must present their Membership Cards upon request for admission to the pool or beach areas. Guests must be registered in advance, in accordance with the Guest Member policies noted in these House Rules and their use of the pool and beach areas may be subject to the payment of applicable guest fees.

4.2. Hours of Operation. The pool will be open daily, weather permitting, from 9:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m., from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Children may use the pool until 9:00 p.m.

The pool and beach areas will be closed during inclement weather. In the event of thunder or lightning, the pool will remain closed until twenty (20) minutes have elapsed since the thunder or lightning. All users are responsible for their own

safety in the pool and beach area during hazardous weather conditions. While the Club will attempt to warn users and close the pool and beach when conditions dictate, under no circumstances shall the Club be held liable for failing to warn users of hazardous weather conditions or the need to vacate the pool or beach area.

4.3. Swimming Rules. If there is no lifeguard on duty; all persons swim at their own risk. Persons under the age of eight (8) and all minors who are unable to swim are not permitted in the pool or beach area unless accompanied by a parent or other person fourteen (14) years of age or older who agrees to assume responsibility for the child's safety and behavior. Children using the main pool must be toilet trained; children are not allowed to wear diapers in the main pool.

Diving is not allowed. Children under the age of eight (8) may use lifeguard-approved flotation devices, but must remain in the shallow end of the pool. No other flotation devices may be used in the pool, unless approved by the Club.

Pool towels are available in the locker room. Locker room and swimming towels shall not be removed from the Club property. A fee shall be charged to the Club Account for towels not returned. Daily lockers are issued on a first come, first served basis. The Club is not responsible for any lost or stolen articles.

Dangerous conduct, including running and rough play, is not permitted. Wrestling, pushing, dunking, ball playing, and noisy or other hazardous activity

All Persons using the pool or beach areas shall be responsible for their own safety and shall be deemed to have assumed the risk of using the pool or beach areas, and agree, by their presence in these areas, that neither the Club, its Directors, Officers or employees, shall be held liable for any loss, injury or death arising out of the use of the pool or beach areas.

All accidents, regardless of how minor, must be reported to the Club staff.

## **ARTICLE 5.**

### **SPA RULES**

5.2. Spa Rules. Persons using the spa do so at their own risk. Elderly Persons, pregnant women, infants and those with health conditions requiring medical care should consult a physician before entering the spa. Children under the age of sixteen (16) are not permitted to use the spa unless accompanied by a parent. Use of the spa while under the influence of alcohol, narcotics, drugs or medications is not permitted. Persons using the spa should be aware that extended

The Club reserves the right to set aside designated time during hours of normal pool operation for special events or programs, during which time use by Members may be restricted.

will not be permitted in the pool area, including the locker rooms. Club employees shall have full authority to maintain order, reprimand, discipline, restrict and evict any individual not complying with the pool and beach rules. Radios, televisions and similar electronic devices may be listened to if played at a volume, which is not offensive to other Persons. Snorkels, fins, masks, kick boards, weights and inflatable devices are not permitted in the pool unless permission is obtained from the pool manager or their use is required for a class. Balls, water balloons, frisbees and other flying objects are not permitted in the pool area.

No food or beverages are allowed unless served by the Club. China, glass, drinking glasses and sharp objects are not permitted in the pool and beach areas. This includes lotions and creams in glass or shatterable plastic containers. Animals, bicycles and skateboards are restricted from the pool area.

Lifesaving and pool cleaning equipment should be used only for the purposes intended.

4.4. Illness, Medical Conditions. Persons are not permitted in the pool if they have a cold, cough, fever, infection of any kind, skin rash, inflamed eye(s), or are wearing bandages.

4.5. Attire. All Persons must wear suitable bathing attire while swimming; no cutoffs, jeans, or bermudas will be permitted. Pool attire must be in good taste. Cover-ups must be worn while walking from the clubhouse to the pool. Shoes must be worn in the clubhouse at all times.

5.1. Spa Hours. The spa will be open daily. The hours the spa will be open shall be determined by the Club considering the season of the year and other circumstances, and are subject to change. The hours of spa operation shall be posted in the clubhouse and published in the newsletter.

use of the spa may result in nausea, dizziness or fainting. The spa should not be used alone.

## **ARTICLE 6.**

### **FITNESS CENTER RULES**

6.1 Persons using the Fitness Center do so at their own risk.

6.2 Fitness Equipment use is limited to 30 minutes per machine use.

6.2 Unless approved by the Club, Children under the age of 16 are not permitted to use the Fitness Center unless accompanied by an adult. Children who do accompany their parents may not play on the fitness equipment, must be supervised and must not disturb the other members in the fitness center.

6.3 Attire: Shirts and Shoes are required while using the Fitness Center. Shoes are optional in the Yoga Room.

6.4 To adjust audio equipment, for assistance consult the Sports Desk personnel.

6.5 In maintaining our standards of excellence, we appreciate your commitment to making this area safe and enjoyable for everyone.

6.6 Captains and crews, and dock guests of members of good standing will have unescorted locker room and laundry privileges. The fitness facilities will be available from 7:00 – 8:00 am and 4:00 – 8:00 pm daily. They may also use the dining, beach and tennis under the guest policy afforded the regular members, which is three times per year.
